i. Conuma -

Conuma Chum - 277 4048 eggs in incubation

Tlupana Chum - 742 813 - eggs in incubation

Conuma Chinook - 3 319 152 eggs in incubation, including 0.5million river release group

Burman Chunook 399 128 eggs in incubation - Great collaboration between Shane and Kadins team to collect more eggs.

Gold R Chinook - 224 466 eggs in incubation - bears got a lot of females - if targets aren't met then all will be released in lake

Clipped Coho smolts - 98 180

ii. Tahsis -

Frank: Fantastic returns this year, brood capture was successful.

Issues: Surface water supply is an issue - there is sand in the pipes. Need to have someone take a look and give estimate to fix/replace

ACTION: Dave Davies will contact DFO engineers.

iii. Zeballos - Roger - with loss of Elmar there is a lack of capacity so only doing school education component for now.

d. Fisheries Management / Area 25 Harvest Committee updates

Roger - seeing large numbers of Chinook in the Burman - a large proportion of these are clipped (likely Robinson Creek) fish. In total 2000 adults were tagged and had over 300 marked recaptures. Radio tagged 30 chum and 1 coho. Average freshwater lifespan (3 fish) was 10 days. There was a relationship observed between entry time and freshwater lifespan.

Kent - finished in season phone calls - there is still an ongoing limited entry chum fishery as of last Friday (October 20th, 2017)

Kent - need to ask DFO for better enumeration on Gold River and clear escapement goals.

Roger - we are putting our chinook stocks at risk by how we manage SEP protocols. We need to be able to mark all chinook and select for wild fish in enhancement protocol. It is expensive to do an adipose clip, but Kadin worked out that it would cost approximately 7 cents per fish to ventral clip. The NSWS would need to pay for assessment and marking - it would be a 3-4 year investment before returns were seen.

Kent - need to develop plan to allocate funding to marking.

Dave - latest from DFO is that SEP protocols/assessment will move towards PNI (proportion natural influence)

Kent: last year we stepped away from stewardship fishery, owners was put on user groups - Bill Peeron (sp) asking wholesale seafood distributors to get their buyers to donate to us.
